
Since 1956 families, friends and their supporters have worked together within the Association to develop opportunities and services for the people. Together they developed educational options, employment services, family support and respite services, public awareness programs, recreational opportunities and more.

They also came together to promote and protect the rights of people who are vulnerable because of their disability.

They did this with the support of many partners and many local citizens who really cared about making a place in their community for people they knew personally.

Now more than ever, the Association has to reach out to secure its future so it can continue to be an effective voice and a resource to families who are concerned about the future for their son or daughter.

Now more than ever, there is a need to strengthen the financial foundation of the Association.



The Association and You

Planned Giving is a program specially designed for the Association in order to secure a better future for people with a developmental disability.

You can become a benefactor to the Association with relative ease. Your lifetime of diligence and hard work has given you certain assets. Through Planned Giving, you have the ability to turn some of your assets to gifts that will support the objects of the Association and receive a direct financial benefit in return. For every planned gift made, there is a significant benefit to you, the donor.

We have selected five kinds of Planned Gifts for your consideration.

- * Bequest in a Will
- * Gift of Life Insurance
- * Gift of Property
- * Gift of Securities
- * Gift of an Annuity

1. Bequest in a Will

If you do not have a Will, you should consult your family and lawyer immediately and have one drawn up. Without a Will, your estate can be tied up in court and eaten away by legal fees and taxes.

Your Will may be used to leave a lump sum or a percentage of your estate to the Association.

2. Life Insurance

A specifically designed life insurance policy with a modest premium that eventually provides a substantial gift to the Association may be an option for you.

You may wish to take out a life insurance plan on yourself or a member of your family with the Association as a beneficiary

You may also have a "paid-up" life insurance policy that you would like to give to the Association.

3. Property

Both residential and commercial property and land can be directly donated to the Association or used to fund a gift annuity.

4. Securities

Stocks, bonds, G.I.C.'s and securities can be donated to the Association. You enjoy the same tax benefit as with a cash gift.

5. Annuities

An annuity gift is like an investment. You give a sum of money to the Association and receive a percentage of the money every year until you die. Any asset (money, RRSP proceeds, property, jewellery, works of art) can be donated to the Association or turned into a gift annuity.
